## Rally News

\* Matt Tabor attended the annual Northwest Rally Council (NWRC) meeting as the RASC representative. Charles Aggenbach was there representing Torque Steerers. From Matt's notes:

The Friday Niter Series will be divided up as follows:

April: NWRC
May: ORCA
June: PSRC
July: ORCA
August: ORCA
September: NWRC
October: RASC

There will be no Night on Bald Mountain this year.

RASC is also running the following events:

Raindrop Rally: April 29 No Alibi: June 2 & 3

Alcan Summer: August 20-28

After a report on the treasury, the group decided to waive the NWRC sanction fees again this year, and that was extended to non-Friday Niter events. Friday Niter entry fees will remain at \$20/entry, and they will continue the 'Bring a New Team, get your entry free' promotion from last year.

There was also information brought up about insurance rates for 2018, and that they MIGHT increase 10-15%. The rate will be settled later.

The Novice and SOP Championships will continue for 2018, and a Masters Championship will be added. SOP will be allowed to include one event as worker points, while the Masters Championship will count up to 3 events as worker points (One event run means you can collect one event for worker points; 2 events run: can collect 2 events as worker points; up to 3 worker event points). Kelly said he would stay on as the Keeper of the Points, since he has 'found a good groove' in the upkeep.

There was some discussion about how to get new people into the sport in general, and the Friday Niter series, specifically. Not too much was resolved here.

My take: several people in attendance were talking about people they know that have said that they would like to try rally. By making sure that we have the events posted on the website and (more importantly) set up as Events on Facebook, we can share those events with friends, post that we are going to the rallies, and invite those people that have expressed interest. I've found that NWRC does a fairly good job of setting up Facebook Events, we just need to propagate them more frequently.

We also talked about YouTube, and the possibility of producing some short videos about rallying.

There was a brief discussion about trophies, and what might be better than the 'cars on tiles' that's been done in the past. I don't recall there being a decision being made about this. (Debbie Sjodin suggested awarding ribbons- ed)

There was also a discussion about timing lights. Pat Biggar offered to repair any that needed it (for free!!), and talk about changing out the incandescent bulbs for LEDs. Nothing came of it.

Current NWRC officers were all reelected.

(The WAG reporter adds that RASC is expected to populate a control/CP on the April and September NWRC-run events, and asked to do same for the PSRC rally in June.)

\* Raindrop (April 29) The Breazeales did another run over the route, taking measurements. That was interrupted by a detour to avoid a flooded roadway. Then resumed for further evaluation and measurements. Carrying tradition, it'll be about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  hours. The scenery on Whidbey Island is nice.

The Farmhouse restaurant, used in 2016, is booked.

## \* Press release:

American Rally Association (ARA) officials are pleased to announce the addition of a seventh event to the 2018 National Series. The Tour de Forest Rally (TdF), based in Olympia and Shelton, Washington, will take place October 6-7, 2018.

The revived event, last run in 1983, represents an exciting new challenge for ARA competitors, placing teams on stage roads unseen in rally competition for thirty-five years. For 2018, the Tour de Forest Rally will return to the tree-covered roads south of Seattle positioned as the final event of the ARA National Series, the potential Championship deciding round.

"We've been working hard to add even more top-level rally events to our 2018 National Series calendar," said ARA Vice President Chris Cyr, "bolstering our already strong 2018 event line up with the revival of Tour de Forest allows us to provide our competitors with even more quality, proven, and historic rally stage roads this year."

Expected to cover 110 stage miles, Tour de Forest will be a Saturday/Sunday event, with Friday October 5, set aside for Recce and the preparation of stage notes. Service will take place in a single location for the weekend in the forest near Shelton, Washington. Stage conditions and road types will be similar to the nearby Olympus Rally, though the two events are distinct and will not share stage roads. Expect a combination of fast and technical gravel roads through forests and low mountains.

Started in 1978 by the Rainier Auto Sports Club as a regional event, Tour de Forest quickly rose to national prominence. Becoming part of the SCCA Pro Rally Championship with its 1979 running, the Tour de Forest Pro Rally saw talented competitors duke it out over the next five years. The event was a contested battleground in multiple championship battles between legendary rally drivers Rod Millen and John Buffum. Each took two wins on the Olympic National Forest stage roads over a four year fight. The following year, in 1983, TdF moved south to Tualatin, Oregon. That year's Tour de Forest, the final running, saw rising star Steve Millen win his first-ever Pro Rally event.

In 1984, the Tour de Forest Pro Rally evolved into the inaugural Oregon Trail Pro Rally, the precursor to the first event of the 2018 ARA National Championship Series, Oregon Trail Rally.

Detailed information regarding the Tour de Forest Rally, as well as associated regional rallies sanctioned by the American Rally Association, will be released in the coming months.
