* Alcan 5000 (August 20-28, 2018) What can go wrong? 27 cars plus 6 staff cars/trucks and 27 motorcycles on a 5,000-mile rally. Make it 100 participants. The answer seems to be, not much.

There were a few DNF's. Brian Cary's Husqvarna developed a death rattle and completed the route on a trailer. Brian was very disappointed. To add more pain, a part was stolen off the bike while parked at a motel.

The yellow mini wagon suffered a death rattle, also. When the magnetic drain plug was removed to start diagnosis, metal pieces were attached, so it spent the rest of it's tour readying for a long trailer ride south. The other Mini (yes, there were two old "real" Minis) had a halfshaft failure, fixed by replacing the bailing wire.

Andy Newell's diesel truck chose to have a bad head gasket, resulting in an extended stay in Fairbanks for Andy while it got fixed. He ran out of "tourist things" to do after 2 days.

The closest to tragedy happened when Steve Perret/Kathryn Hansen parked their Subaru wagon alongside Highway 97 to walk into a TSD to watch the rallyists. They heard a bad noise, and when they got back to the car, the side window was broken and everything inside that wasn't bolted down was gone.

Scoring the rally is usually a chore, this time made worse with the laptop replacement. Kathryn spent many miles of world-class scenery bent over the laptop.

One motorcyclist decided this was a chance of a lifetime to get on an Alaska State ferry and do his own exploring. A neat thing about the ferries is that you can get off at one port, and then hop on the next one after sightseeing.

Paul Dubinsky (South Carolina) and Colin Stenhouse (W. Vancouver, BC) were known as Sweep 2 or "The Big Red Truck", hauling a U-Haul trailer full of the motorcyclist's bags.
