\* Raindrop Rally April 27

Rallymaster Steve Richards reports that it measures out to 110 miles and just over four hours. While still the scenic drive, he hopes the idea of adding some challenge to the basic, simple theme is well received.

When you get down to it, substituting Do-It-Yourself checkpoints isn't much different from our "hidden checkpoints" format. It gets away from time decs, for one thing. The rallyists can be late and still zero the DIY's.

The classic touring rally Route Instructions provide mileages for every instruction, but to add some challenge, this Raindrop will leave a few out. The theory is that this will keep the teams on their toes so the teamwork that is so rewarding will come into play.

Most radical is adding course-following "traps". Steve acknowledges that the rallyists usually add their own, but he has planned a few. Again, the intent is to reward the best teams, and get away from the boredom of an entirely scripted course. He hopes everyone will get a chuckle over them, whether executed correctly or not.

To make it all work, D.Y.I. scorecards will be collected at two points, one at the 20-minute mid-rally break.

\*No Alibi (June 7-8) Rallymaster Eric Horst and Marvin Crippen have made the first route exploration to the Walla Walla area to scope out roads. Then decided on Tri-Cities. No word on whether they checked out motels and restaurants.

\* Olympus (April 19-20) Rally America officials have reviewed the roads and made a few changes. Saturday's event commences at 10 AM and finishes at 7:30. Sunday's MTC is 9AM, 4 stages, and concludes at 2. Route Book mileages add up to 267 miles, 50% are stages.
