Rally News

Jeff, McMillen wrangled the elegant and stunning trophies.

* Tom Palidar handed out the NWRC awards following the RASC trophy ceremony. Running all 8 events resulted with Novice Class trophies for the Charles Aggenbach/Mary Lee class winners. Aaron Samuelson/David Johnson swapped driver/navigator duties over the year, to win trophies.

The SOP Class winners were also present: Scott and Karina Miller. Ben Thompson won SOP class at the RASC Friday Niter (and a respectable 10th O'all) to also earn 2nd in the yearly championship.

* Mt. Hood Rally (October 24) had 25 cars, 8 moto entrants. The Saturday-only rally followed the usual script of 3 roads to total 7 stages.

The bikes followed the cars by 5 minutes, with their own pace car. This allowed them to follow the tracks left by the cars, since reading RI's is difficult-to-impossible. Their times compared to mid-pack cars. Because of past course-following problems, Rich Olmstead also made sure the Transits were arrowed.

NASA provided the sanction. Entry fees were \$445 for cars, \$220 for the moto entrants. Simon Levear was chairman, with the usual cast making up the rest of the positions. Mike and Paula Gibeault arrived from California to do scoring.

RASC was represented by Ron Sorem/ Jeff McMillen in the "00" car and Mark Nolte working at the "Gilhouley" stage ATC.

- 2. February Rally of the 100 Acre Wood Salem, MO
 - 3. April Olympus Rally Olympia, WA
 - 4. May Oregon Trail Rally Hood River, OR
- 5. June Susquehannock Trail Performance Rally Wellsboro, PA
 - 6. July New England Forest Rally Newry, ME

Three rally events that were on the calendar in 2009, the Ojibwe Forests Rally in Bemidji, MN, Rally Colorado in Steamboat Springs, CO, and the Lake Superior Performance Rally in Houghton, MI, will be changed to regional-level rally events and will not be included in the 2010 Rally America National Rally Championship.

...In addition, some of North America's top rally drivers from the Rally America National Rally Championship series will be invited to compete in ESPN's Summer X Games competition, the leading action sports event broadcast live on ABC and ESPN. Rally America officials will once again be involved in the organizational aspect of the rally car racing segment of competition for X Games 16 which is scheduled for July 29 to August 1, 2010.

RAINDROP HISTORY - recap from file

March 18, 1984- Mark Nolte- RM. Bellevue Square over Cougar Mt., then Maple Valley and the Pipeline Rd. Then Lk. Sawyer and up Lk. Holmes Rd. Tour farmlands between Enumclaw and Auburn, to finish at Pietro's Pizza in Auburn. Only 5 checkpoints. The route instructions were typed, the Alpines hand-drawn. 52 entrants.

March 10, 1985- Mark Nolte-RM. Bellevue Square (with the first RI saying "L", and drawn T-right!) to Newport Way, then over Cougar Mt. To Cedar Grove, then Lk. Wilderness and the Pipeline Rd (a 3.80 mi. regularity.) Enumclaw to Mud Mountain Dam, then to Buckley. South to Burnett, a 7.53 mi. regularity that ends at South Prairie. We went north via Mundy Loss Rd to Angeline Rd, painfully slow at the 25 speed limit. Then past the Puget Power/Lk. Tapps power plant to Auburn. This was the first event with computers- The Raemer's brought their IBM, and the RI's were done on a Macintosh.

(4 hours, 106 mi.)

1986- Mark Nolte- RM- Start at Town and Country AMC/Renault in north Seattle, to McCollum Park (128th exit off I-5) TSD over Seattle Hill Road to Lowell, take I-5 to Marysville and the Tulalip Indian Reservation. Long, slow TSD to Kayak Pt. State Park, then TSD thru Warm Beach, Stanwood, to end next to I-5. Monte to Arlington. TSD the 25-mile Jordan Rd to Granite Falls. Monte south to Storm Lake Road, (Hello Monroe). Transit to Kenmore and Pietro's Pizza. (130 mi. 4 hours)

1987- Mike Jones -RM. Play around Rally Valley

April 17,1988- Peter Linde- RM (The RI's were handwritten. A snafu kept them from being typed or computer generated. But Pete is the very picture of personal grooming, his cars are perfect...but his handwriting was...legible) Start at R. Gyles Restaurant on Rose Hill above Kirkland. Odo to Carnation Farm, TSD to Union Hill. Pass the Red Brick Road (Redmond) to Transit to Big Rock Road. TSD around Lk. Marcel, then Transit to High Bridge Road. This had the wooden bridge then-slippery when wet. Follow Hwy 522 to Ben Howard Rd. TSD the Ben Howard Rd to Sultan for lunch. North to Lk. Bosworth for a fun Monte, then TSD back Creswell Rd, a loop of 23 or so miles. Monte the Storm Lake Rd. then transit for 20 miles to finish at Bothell's Petro's Pizza. (154 mi., 5:25)

1989-

March 25, 1990 - Mark Nolte- RM- Start at La Casa Real, Fife. Odo to Gig Harbor Park, then TSD north to Southworth. A 7 mi. Monte to Manchester Park. TSD north to Hwy 160 and Transit thru Gig Harbor (best view of Bremerton Harbor) to Kitsap Lake. Then back-to-back TSD's across the peninsula and to Seabeck Park. South to Holly. The delightful Dewatto Rd was a Monte, then Tee Lake to Belfair Park was also a Monte. After a stop at the park, head SE to Burley by way of Flora Rd, and the Bremerton Airport area. Last transit went back to La Casa Real Restaurant. (147 mi., 4:48.)

May 1, 1991 -Mike Jones - RM- (Looks like a Mark Nolte rally, especially when Jones was in Phoenix at the time)

Start at Coachman Mazda in Olympia. Odo south to Little Rock. TSD south on the Mima Road to Hwy 12, near Rochester. A short Transit thru Rochester, then TSD south to Centralia. 20-mile transit to Rainbow Falls Park, then another 6 mile Transit to Pe Ell. An 11-mile TSD past Boistfort (pronounced "Baw-faw"), followed by a 13 mile Monte to Winlock. Back to I-5, and north to drive thru Centralia. We looped past the Centralia Coal Fired Generators (which put out more power than Ross, Diablo, and Gorge dams combined, but use 800 tons of coal, per hour, to do it). This got us to Bucoda, where the rally kept north thru Tenino to 7 mile TSD near Lake Offut. The Rally ended at Petro's Pizza in Lacey (166 mi., 4:50)

1992- Cancelled

May 2, 1993- Rod Johnson- RM. 31 entrants. Bellevue to Hobart, then TSD to Ravensdale. 9 mile Monte to Cumberland, then TSD thru recent clear-cut to nearly Enumclaw. Transit to Mud Mountain Dam, then TSD toward Buckley. Scenic Carbonado and Wilkeson, then TSD to South Prairie. Back to Buckley. Found Franklin on the TSD, then to the short Lake Walker TSD (up the dead end road on a TSD, Transit out). Finish at 4 Corners, east of Kent. (117 mi. 4:07)

April 17, 1994- Mark Nolte- RM, 43 entrants. Start at The Narrows, Key Bank. Odo check went to Gig Harbor City Park, then west to Hwy 3, and short Transit to Belfair State Park. Belfair Park to Tee Lake, in the middle of the Kitsap Peninsula. This led to the Dewatto Monte, where a nice view of the Hood Canal was all you saw, since the snowcapped Olympics were blocked by mist. TSD north alongside the fjord to Holly and Seabeck Park. Then TSD to nearly Bremerton, catch a transit thru Gorst to Pt. Orchard. Follow Beach Drive to Manchester Park.

The Olalla Valley was an 11 mi. TSD, and a short Transit finished at the Olympic Village Round Table Pizza (near Purdy). (136 mi. 4:30)

April 30, 1995- Mark Nolte-RM- 35 entrants/ 16 novices. 12 CP's Start Key Bank in Lynnwood. Freeway to Lowell Park, then to Machias, (near Lk. Stevens, if anywhere). We went north to Granite Falls on a 25 minute TSD, Transited thru Granite Falls to take the Jordan Road as a long TSD. We took a side trip up Jim Creek Road to see what there was to see of the Navy Communications site, then back thru Arlington to TSD past some large, stately farms and the Pilchuck Glass estate. A Transit on Old Hwy 99, alongside I-5, got us on a TSD in the flatlands north of Stanwood, which we avoided to get to Kayak Point State Park. Then TSD past Warm Beach to "nearly" Sylvana. The last TSD went past new housing developments to I-5. Finish at Alfy's Pizza at Silver Lake. (147 mi., 4:13)

April 28, 1996- Jim & Cristy Breazeale -RM 42 entrants shared a lovely day (between the rainy ones) for the challenge of a TSD tour from Bellevue to Woodinville, by way of Granite Falls.

 $\underline{\text{April } 27,\,1997} - \text{Jim \& Cristy Breazeale were rallymasters, } 15 \text{ CP's.}$

 $\underline{\text{April 26, 1998}}\text{-} \text{ Mark Nolte -RM- 32 Entrants/ 9}$ novices. $\underline{\text{12 CP's}}$

Start at South Sound Shopping Center, Lacey. >Matlock, Elma Finish: Izzy's Pizza, near the Black Lake Mall shopping center. (123 mi., 4:26)

May 2, 1999- Mark Nolte-RM-, 17 entrants. 15 mile Odo to Maltby, TSD to Lowell Park (south Everett). Transit past Everett to Sylvana, TSD west to Marine View Drive for 18 miles, then Transit north on I-5 to the north most point, Starbird Road. TSD passed the Pilchuck Glass center to end 16 mi. later, at Hwy 9. A short jaunt south, thru Arlington, then Burn Road to Granite Falls. Granite Falls south, via Bosworth to Machias, and it's Centennial Park. 13 mostly freeway miles ended at Alfy's Pizza at Silver Lake. (129 mi., 4:10)

 $\underline{2000}$ - Burned out, Nolte didn't want to do it. No one else did, either

April 29, 2001- Mark Nolte – RM. 30 entrants, 17 novices. 17 CP's First year for Website registration. Lakewood Park & Ride to Spanaway

<u>April 28, 2002</u> – Steve Willey, Rallymaster 42 entrants / 22 novices.

April 27, 2003 – Steve Willey, Rallymaster 43 entrants / 14 novices, 10 CPs. Featured Ohop Valley, finish in Spanaway

 $\underline{\text{April } 18,2004}$ - 32 entrants, 19 CP's. Gnomes on Kitsap Peninsula were highlight.

April 17, 2005 - 28 entrants, Mark Nolte was Rallymaster, Ron Sorem and others did route. Massive reroute when scheduled opposite bicycle tour in north Pierce County

April 23, 2006 - Steve Richards, Rallymaster. 31 entrants, Nautical theme on Whidbey Island

2007- Cancelled, no rallymaster

April 27, 2008– Steve Richards (RM) tried adding some easy traps to the format. Everett to Smokey Point. 16 entrants. 110 miles, 3-1/2 hours

April 26, 2009 – Gig Harbor to Gig Harbor, Mark Weber, Rallymaster. 37 entrants. 160 mi.
