At the late notification date Olympus organizer Steve McQuaid felt there wasn't time to explore the legal options. You may recall that the Olympus organizers were so disillusioned with RA's performance in 2012 that they didn't want to take a chance on a repeat.

Ray Hocker is a NW native and hopefully will get to visit for The Nameless Rally as well as Idaho Rally."

Nameless Performance (*namelessperformance.com/*) is a car prep and mod shop headquartered in SW Washington. A real company. They were involved with bringing the Summit rally team to the US from Australia for the 2012 season. *The "Trail of the Gnu" by the Calgary (AB) Sports Car Club drew 21 entries. Trivia

* Our current headlight configuration laws date back a long ways. Sealed beams were an advance over badly sealed (.... then comes corrosion) bulb-and-reflector configurations. Good enough in 1940. Those were the only legal option until 1984, when the bulb, lens, reflector assembly was promoted for fuel-saving aerodynamics.

One aspect has continued since 1968. Switching is legally limited to high and low. Audi (and probably others) have asked that the law be changed to allow more lighting options. Audi needs the 45-year-old law to make accommodations for the company's "matrix-beam headlights." These headlights are made of multiple LED bulbs that dim and brighten individually, more complex than just a high-low setting.

LEDs are coming. The flirtation with HIDs may be limited to just low beams, since they don't like being turned on-and off.

* Steve Richards is busy bonding with his new Mazda 6. The steerable headlights work well. The gas mileage is an improvement over the previous model.

His top-of-the-line blue-grey car has a thick manual, and not just something to take up space in the glove box. Set up the electric garage door opener? Check.
