Club News

*From Roy Ward: "I'm home. I'll be reading the owner's manual for my new "Mr. Heartbeat" device for the next few days.

"On Wednesday (the 27th) I went to the mail room at my apartment. I had been feeling bleaugh for the previous days, but this trip of 300 feet was like climbing Mt. Everest. Every muscle in my body felt like I had been doing workouts, and ached that lactic acid ache. On the way back from the mailroom, I was beginning to wonder if I was going to make it.

"When I did get back in my apartment, I called a 24/7 nurses' hotline, and after pressing 1, 3, 7, 3, 8, 5, 3 again, and "0", I got hold of a nurse. I told her my symptoms. She said, "Hang up. Call 911 NOW." So I did. I got two aid cars to my apartment, and when they hooked me up to the monitor, the paramedic asked, "What's your pulse, usually?" I told him 70 to 90. He said, "Not anymore. It's 29. Your heart is dying." So they loaded me up on the gurney, and I did my best Monty Python ("I'm not dead yet!"), and we headed off to Evergreen. Nothing quite like riding in a bouncing, swerving aid car while a paramedic tries to find a vein in a patient with no blood pressure.

"We arrived at the ER, and the doctor there got all concern-faced, when the next thing I knew I met a cardiac surgeon in scrubs. That's when I got five stents and a power cord to my heart shoved up my femoral artery. An external pacemaker was connected to that to keep my heart going overnight. Then Thursday morning I went into surgery to have an internal pacemaker installed. I had never experienced Fentanil before, and I must say, that is some powerful stuff. No anesthetic. Just Fentanil. It makes you feel reeeeeeal gooooood.

"Friday the cardiologist said I could go home, but it took the nursing staff a few hours to get around to removing the collection of body piercings from my arms and hands. A friend picked me up and brought me here, where I had to sort through 442 emails.

"I'm going to be a while recovering from the hospital food."

-no checkpoint workers required, only one person to Score final results.

-any type of vehicle could participate (secretary is thinking about motorcycles)

- -30 waypoints/positions
- -would start in normal Friday Nighter location.
- -Each waypoint would require answering a question (more difficult=more points) to prove competitor visited

-Event has a time limit, not enough to reach all checkpoints so competitors would have to choose wisely.

A map would be marked with checkpoints and their graduated difficulty. Some discussion was had about this possibly encouraging speeding to collect all checkpoints, but in the end it was unanimous that Steve should go ahead with the plan and present it to NWRC at the annual meeting.
