There were five DNF's. The Saab 900 (Topal/Carr) discovered a failed axle seal after topping it up, then the car screeched to a halt outside Fairbanks. Probably a transmission failure, so it was headed to be junked. Only the junkyard wouldn't take it! On the wrecker, the real problem was evident; a loose brake caliper jammed the wheel. New bolts got it fixed and the car arrived very late in Anchorage for the finish.

The Graf/Uhler Audi 90 (ex-Breazeale) went off on the Blackwater TSD. Once it regained the road, everything seemed fine for a while until it decided to steer "oddly". A bent suspension and radiator issues made it unwise to continue. A noisy transmission parked the Xie/Cao Jeep Wrangler rather than hazard a total failure where the tow bill gets into big numbers.

The Du/Du Subaru ran badly after the Yellowknife ice race. Theory is that a valve seal didn't take kindly to the extreme heat-cold cycles, so the car may still be in Yellowknife awaiting a long haul.

After awards at Anchorage, three cars went back to get pictures north of the Arctic Circle. Hardcore.

* Raindrop rally (April 17) – The Whidbey Island touring TSD will start at the Mount Vernon visitor's center and finish at a restaurant about 10 miles west on Highway 20.
