* National-level stage rally evolves into 2 series. Part of the announcement: "The inaugural 2017 ARA National Championship series currently consists of five rallies: Oregon Trail Rally in Portland, Oregon dates TBD, the Olympus Rally in Shelton, Washington in May, the Susquehannock Trail Performance Rally (STPR) in Wellsboro, PA in June, the New England Forest Rally in Newry, Maine in July, and the Ojibwe Forests Rally in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota in August. Additional events and the fully event calendar for 2017 will be announced later this fall."

* Marinus and Renee Damm ran the Targa Newfoundland (Sept 11-16). To summarize the results:

Targa Classic class: 12 finishers, Targa Modern class: 10 finishers Targa Open class: 13 finishers Grand Touring class: 10 finishers

Lucas Oil Targa Challenge class 13 finishers Master Targa Challenge class: 9 finishers

Master Touring class: 4 finishers.

The Damms won the 1) Grand Touring, 2) Lucas Challenge and 3) Master Touring classes in their 2001 Porsche Carrera 4. The Lucas Challenge win included entry to the 2017 event along with the trophy.

* September 24: Formerly known as the "Wild West", the fall Puget Sound-area stage rally, sanctioned by NASA, was called "Doo Wop". Besides making trophy design rally easy, it carried on the Ray Damitio notion of keeping it simple and cheap. For example, instead of a fancy awards presentation, the vast gravel parking lot of the Cook Reload sufficed for both the Service Area and post rally awards.

Recce was mandatory, and since the teams would be creating their own "notes", the Route Instructions were available online – and only 13 pages for the total, repetitive, route.

Blessed with the help (!) of Green Diamond Resource Company, 2 "roads" were used this year in a tight area west of Matlock, each run three times for a total of 49 miles of stages and only 16 miles of transits. 37 starters, 9 DNFs.

RASC was represented with Ron Sorem/Jim Breazeale as "00" car, Steve Perret in "000" while Kathryn Hansen co-drove for Mark Tabor. Mark Nolte and Cristy Breazeale worked controls.

* A week later, September 30/October 1, the Canadian National rally series made it's west coast stop for Pacific Forest Rally. It ran on Friday night and Saturday on 4 roads around Merritt, B.C.

* The CARS PFR brought out two "devices" new to me. I didn't get to see the checkpoint clocks in action; they come with the light-beam for recording the time the rally car crosses the line, and have a radio link to the STOP Control.

The other was in-car "Rally Safe", with a mind-boggling number of features.



GPS tracks each car as it traverses the stage, and alerts HQ if a car is off- and where! Plus a button for "OK" from the affected team. It has a car-to-car Wi-Fi capability that alerts to a passing request. It

displays time and mileage; one team was going to use it as their rally odometer. (Ron Sorem mentioned that his was within a hundredth!)
