# Rally News

\*Rainier provided a checkpoint crew for the June Friday Niter, this time presented by the NWRC, with Kelly Smith as rallymaster. Charles Aggenbach, Rod Johnson and Nolte set up at well-used location outside of Snohomish on Lowell-Latimer road.

A half-hour before first car was due, taillights blinked far up the road, with numerous passersby slowing down, then moving on. The CP crew concluded that someone had decided to have car trouble on the narrow road.

Minutes before the first car, the flashing red lights of emergency vehicles started arriving, messing up the traffic flow, as they are required to do.

The CP crew collected time declarations from all 15 cars, often educating the teams on the method.

The real man behind the Curtain assembled all of the notes and has created an epic journey and my summation would not do it justice:

From Ron Sorem:

"1233 miles later...

"Asotin County and the Washington DOT threw us a curve and are closing the SR129 interchange at Fleischman Way. Our route goes through there three times. Or rather it used to --- now it has a re-written path with fewer traffic signals and less congestion.

Idaho is repaving US12 and US95. This will likely be spiffy and new and gone by September, but the detour getting out of town Friday and Sunday actually makes for a better transition onto US12... Friday afternoon traffic the last few times on surveys has been a bit like playing "Frogger". The detour/rewrite now uses a traffic signal.

Population gains have made finding our kind of roads troublesome. The surveys for 2012 found good fun routes, but over the intervening years, new houses have cut into the fun a bit. A section with 27 houses over the afternoon has now been bypassed and rewritten down to only a few houses, losing one hillclimb, and still giving us plenty of switchbacks. Friday is now a bit friendlier to the natives and the rally won't notice.

Saturday had another "houses too close" section that has now been rewritten with a little more paved, a lot less quiet needed... Also Saturday, after lunch had a TSD with 9 miles of good road a half mile of just too rough from winter runoff. Survey 5 looked at other roads, found no good options other than a parallel stretch of Hwy3 added to the transit. It's quicker, scenic, no quiet zones, and won't break any cars. It will be a great way to survive the after lunch coma...

Sunday morning saw one rewrite to bypass what we've called the Wallace family Sunday breakfast party. A Quiet Zone where you could reach out and touch the parked cars. We're not invited, it's too "intimate" and too slow, so we went a different way, dropping one hairpin, and getting a friendly wave from the landowner.

We were a bit too early for lunch at the Forest Saloon, but management has us on their calendar for September. We're working on the menu details, leaning toward a "rally picnic" -- order ahead, with the lunches being ready when we arrive. More on the menu as we get closer to the date.

Survey 4 found a new loop to remedy a lost road. On that weekend we were dealing with mushroom hunters and very crowded roads. Now, Survey 5 accomplished final measurements on a holiday weekend with nearly no other cars! Guess they all went "elsewhere".

Wildlife sightings included several raptor species; mule deer bucks in velvet, does with tiny fawns; chukar; Canada geese with goslings; bluebirds, goldfinches, meadowlarks; wild turkey toms and hens with chicks; quail; a grouse or two; lots of whitetail does and fawns; lots of coyotes and one chubby little coyote pup.

Temperature leaving Clarkston 96 Coolant temps approached 210 a few times on the hillclimbs.

Routebook will be ready for the checkout crew after the 4th."

The final check run will be done by Marvin and Eric. They are veteran competitors and will have the

opportunity to offer any suggestions, solutions and options on what they find.

The Social Media blitz continues to bear fruit. We are up to 34 entrants! While we have said we would limit the field to 40 cars, interest remains strong with several folks giving verbal commitments. 50 cars for 50 years has a nice ring to it. Again, thanks to all who post, like and share.

With the route book pretty much in a near final state, we'll begin to focus more on marketing and apparel.

Another local team has stepped up and added to the coffers. The Dammralliers have topped the list with a \$400 contribution. I cannot thank them enough but you can try Gentle Readers.

We are narrowing the choices down on apparel. If you have any input or ideas, contact us now. We have discussed a nice polo/golf type shirt in user-friendly colors with some embroidery on it or perhaps a light outer garment.

Very few people will recognize the huge amount of effort this is taking. This is a big deal for the club. I am surprised at the generosity of many of us. I continue to offer opportunities to anyone who wants to contribute. There are still plenty of details that need attention. We'll welcome any help.
